Deadline for Communications Survey Extended

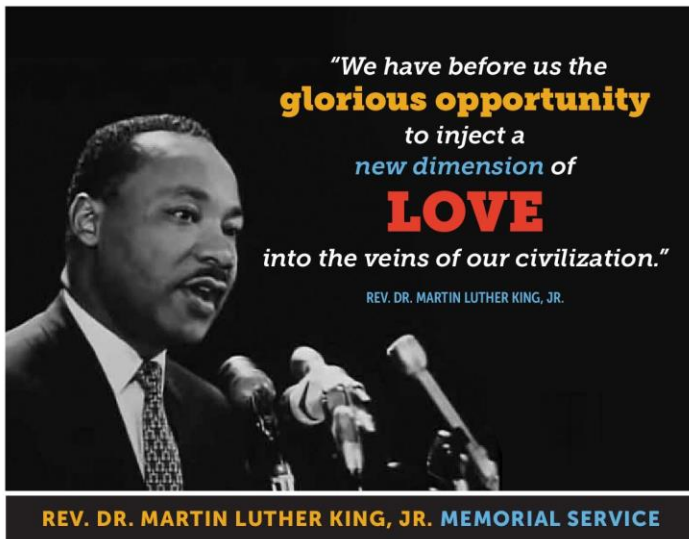
Residents and the business community now have an additional week to complete the Township's communications survey. The survey has been extended by one week and closes next Friday, February 19, 2021.
