

Northern Montgomery County Recycling Commission wants residents to know:

WHAT AND HOW TO RECYCLE FOR CURBSIDE COLLECTION

Aluminum, Steel & Bimetal Cans

All metal food, beverage and aerosol cans are recyclable.

All other metal items such as, pots and pans, wire hangers are **not** recyclable. No lids or covers, just cans. Rinse out and crush aluminum cans if possible.



Plastics Number 1 & 2

(HDPE & PETE)

Look for the number in the triangle on the bottom of plastic items.

No lids, rinse out containers.



Glass – Clear, Amber and Green Glass

All glass food, beverage bottles and jars are recyclable. No lids or covers



Newspapers, Magazines & Junk Mail

Tie in a bundle or place in a paper bag
(Not in Plastic Bags)



TELEVISION RECYCLING AVAILABLE!!!

Montgomery County Household Hazardous Waste Collection Program accepts televisions.

Best Buy Stores nationwide now offer electronics recycling. Bring TVs and computers to DVD players and more to any Best Buy Store. Best Buy does not charge a fee for recycling of most consumer electronics. However, they do charge \$10 for TVs 32" and under, CRTs, monitors and laptops, which is offset with a \$10 Gift Card. For info on recycling televisions greater than 32" contact Best Buy Stores or visit their website at www.bestbuy.com. Stores can accept up to two household items per day.

Use earth911.org to find the nearest place that takes items not picked up at curbside. Just type in what you want to recycle and your zip code and a list of recyclers for your products will appear. Some of the recyclables accepted are batteries, cardboard, household cleaners, lawn and garden products, electronics, etc.

August 8, 2009 – Abington High School, Parking Lot – 970 Highland Avenue, Abington, PA.

October 24, 2009 - Lower Merion Transfer Station, 1300 Woodbine Avenue, Penn Valley, PA

Please bring to collection sites for safe disposal.

Automotive Products: Motor oil, transmission fluid, brake fluid, antifreeze, gasoline and kerosene.

Household Products: Drain and oven cleaners, spot remover, dry cleaning fluid and rug cleaner.

Paint Products: Paint thinner or turpentine, paint remover, oil based paint, furniture stripper and furniture refinisher. **DO NOT BRING LATEX PAINT!**

Electronic Products: Monitors, small televisions, computers, PDA's, printer and cell phones.

Pesticides and Herbicides. Please bring mercury containing devices.

Miscellaneous: Dyes, lighter fluids, photographic chemicals, concrete or asphalt sealers and swimming pool chemicals. **DO NOT BRING PROPANE CONTAINERS.**
