The Township will repair and repave or resurface the following roads this summer. Wyndon Road



#### CDC Updates Guidance for Fully Vaccinated People

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention released updated health recommendations for fully vaccinated people on Tuesday, April 27, 2021. Pennsylvania's mask order <u>automatically</u> <u>incorporates</u> updated CDC guidance on masking.

People are considered fully vaccinated two weeks after their second dose in a two-dose series or two weeks after a single-dose vaccine. Under the new guidance, fully vaccinated people:

- Do not need to wear a mask outdoors, except in certain crowded settings and venues.
- Can continue to work following an exposure as long as they are asymptomatic.
- May be exempted from routine screening testing, if feasible.
- May visit indoors with other fully vaccinated people without masks or social distancing.
- May visit indoors with unvaccinated people from a single household at low risk for severe COVID-19 without masks or social distancing.
- Do not need to quarantine or be tested following a known exposure if asymptomatic.

Fully vaccinated people should continue to take precautions in indoor public settings, such as wearing a mask and social distancing; avoid large indoor in-person gatherings; follow employer guidance; and get tested if experiencing COVID-19 symptoms. <u>Click here</u> for more.
